

# BAIL DENIED IN COUNTY KILLING

Patrolman Thomas' Case Is  
Continued To Monday.

Capt. Powell Shot In Self-De-  
fense, Says Prisoner.

## HOLD FUNERAL TO-MORROW

County Judge Samuel W. Greene yesterday denied bail to County Patrolman Frank Thomas, of Rockford Station, who early yesterday morning shot and killed Capt. E. H. Powell, head of the county police force. Thomas is charged with murder. His case was continued on the docket until 2 o'clock Monday afternoon, and he was remanded to jail.

Funeral services for Capt. Powell will be held at 2:30 o'clock to-morrow afternoon at the family residence, 2931 Bank street. Lewis Lodge of Masons, of which he was a member, will have charge of the services.

### Born In Louisville.

The victim was 35 years old and a native of this city. He was a son of the late William Powell, a mail carrier. He made his home with his mother, Mrs. Annie E. Powell. Besides his mother he leaves two sisters, Mrs. Annie B. Pollard and Miss Effie Powell. He was a carpenter, appointed a probation officer by County Judge Greene several years ago and placed in charge of the county patrolmen following the resignation of Frank Thomas six months ago. Powell was a member of Harmony Camp, Modern Woodmen of America, and was captain of the drill team.

The shooting occurred at Clark Station, on the Eighteenth-street road, in front of the saloon and grocery of Snider & Schell. William Snider, who resigned his position as county patrolman Tuesday, is one of the proprietors of the establishment, and a number of county officers had attended the opening. A quarrel arose between Capt. Powell and Thomas regarding assignments of county patrolmen and the shooting ensued. Thomas claims self-defense. He alleges that Capt. Powell knocked him down and was in the act of drawing his revolver when he fired the three shots while lying on the ground.

### Powder Burns Shown.

Coroner Ellis Duncan found the shots were fired at close range, all the wounds being powder burned. He will hold an inquest. One bullet fractured Powell's skull at the left temple, but did not penetrate the brain. Another pierced his heart, while the third cut his intestines and the blood vessel supplying the left kidney. County Patrolman Steve Crimmons disarmed Thomas and placed him under arrest.
